Headquartered in Copenhagen Denmark, UNOPS is fully self-financing, prompting efficiency and financial discipline.

We provide support in three main areas:

- Infrastructure

UNOPS focuses its operations in its core areas of expertise: project management, physical infrastructure and procurement.

Within these areas, we offer three kinds services that are tailored to the needs of partners:

- Advisory: developing national capacity in our core mandated areas of project management, physical infrastructure and procurement.
- Implementation: implementing partners' projects efficiently and effectively with the involvement of all stakeholders.
- Transactional: providing stand-alone HR management and procurement services.

UNOPS delivers services through its global headquarters in Copenhagen, Denmark and a decentralized network of more than 30 country and partnership offices.

The Annual Statistical Report on United Nations Procurement is compiled each year by UNOPS on behalf of the wider UN system.

The report includes data on the total value of goods and services procured by UN organizations and profiles of all countries of supply.
