UNFPA Procurement Services Branch has been providing reproductive health supplies for the developing world for almost 50 years. Our expertise extends to managing a global supply chain that responds to the needs of our partners in development.

Today, UNFPA is one of the largest public sector procurers of Reproductive Health (RH) commodities.







What is a Long-Term Agreement (LTA)?



A written agreement

Between a UN organization and a supplier

For pre-selected goods or services

Based on the result of a competitive bidding exercise

Covers general terms and conditions and all commercial terms

Pricing

Discounts

Payment

Delivery

Packing



Benefits of Using UNFPA LTAs



- All products have gone through competitive bidding process
- Pooled volume > better price > cost savings
- Stabilize supply costs
- Avoid duplication of procurement processes
- Direct ordering

 - Share best practices among suppliers;
 - Enhance supply performance to UNFPA;
